
Women in the Wisconsin Legislature, 2011 update

The number of women elected to in the Wisconsin State Legislature increased to 34 (from 31) following the August and November 2011 special elections. As a result women now hold 26% of all seats in the State Legislature.

Women gained **two seats** in the Senate, with one woman moving from the Assembly to the Senate. In addition, one woman was elected to the Assembly to fill an open seat.

Woman now hold 10 seats in the Senate (30%), which is the highest level in a decade (see table).

Women in Local Government

Women hold about **one in five seats** (21%) in local governments across Wisconsin. This percentage increased only slightly over the five—year period from 2005 to 2010.

Women hold about one in ten leadership positions in the elected bodies of Wisconsin's local governments, such as City Council, Village, Town and School Board Presidents and City Mayors.
