

10 Things You Can Do Today To Help Fight Human Trafficking

*Every person, business, agency and organization can help
make the community safer and fight human trafficking.*

1. Schedule a brown bag lunch or coffee break to share materials and information you received today with your co-workers.
2. Designate a human trafficking point of contact in your organization to keep staff up-to-date and connected to anti-trafficking efforts.
3. Learn the red flags that might indicate human trafficking. Visit the Wisconsin Department of Justice Human Trafficking webpage (www.doj.state.wi.us) and the National Human Trafficking Resource Center website (www.traffickingresourcecenter.org) for resources and information.
4. Share information about human trafficking with **3** organizations in your community that are in the position to identify and report suspected trafficking (such as travel plaza/truck stops, fast food restaurants, school boards, postal workers, nail and hair salons, landlords, teachers, motels, bus stations, etc.).
5. Incorporate information about human trafficking into your organization's website, trainings or professional association meetings.
6. Watch the "Blue Campaign" videos about human trafficking and share the site with **2** friends or co-workers (<http://www.dhs.gov/gallery/blue-campaign-video>).
7. Volunteer to share your professional services with anti-trafficking groups and/or organizations that work with those vulnerable to being trafficked, such as runaways.
8. Learn about how the trucking industry is helping victims of human trafficking. Visit Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) online (www.truckersagainstrafficking.org) and share the TAT resources with travel plazas and truck stops in your area.
9. If you provide services that could help a victim of human trafficking (or know of an organization that does), make sure the organization is registered with the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline: www.traffickingresourcecenter.org.
10. **If you see something, say something!** Tips from the community make a difference in the fight against human trafficking!
