She graduated from Marquette University with Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Cardinal Stretch with a Master of Science in Management, and served three terms as a Tribal Council Legislator. Jo Ann is a founding member of Milwaukee's Indian Summer Festival and Mohican Veterans, and started the Mohican Writers Circle, who wrote "Reflections on the Waters that are Never Still".
