


Nearly *Half* of current Female County Board Supervisors have taken office since 2015 (i.e., in 2016, '17, '18, or '19). Percent of County Board Supervisor Seats Held by Women, 2005-2019

Women serve as County Board Chair in 9 of 72 WI Counties. Women make up 12.5% of Chairs and 25% of Vice Chairs, largely unchanged over the past decade.

Among women *and* men, nearly
40% of current County Supervisors have taken office since 2015.

WOMEN ON COUNTY BOARDS

In 2019, women held 330 seats on WI County Boards, accounting for 20.6% of all Supervisors statewide up 2% from 18.6% in 2015, and a slight increase from 20.4% in 2017

2017 marked the first increase since 2005 in the percentage of women serving on WI County Boards. See chart on reverse.

ON THE RUN



The net increase of 30 female Supervisors (300 to 330) masks a larger movement of women elected to Wisconsin County Boards.

More than 150 of the 330 women currently serving on a County Board took office between 2015 and 2019. Since 2005, the Women's Council has tracked and published data on women in state and local elected offices in Wisconsin, including posting election fact sheets updating data on Women the in the WI Legislature.
